

## QUARTERLY REPORT & APPENDIX 5B

Triangle Energy (Global) Limited (“Triangle” or the “Company”) is pleased to present its quarterly report for the period ended 30 September 2013.

### HIGHLIGHTS

#### Pase PSC (Aceh Province, North Sumatra, Indonesia)

- Production from A-1 well restored to normal following a successful “Bull Head Acid Job”
- MIGAS extended Triangle’s appointment as the temporary operator of the Pase Block until 24 February 2014 or until a definitive operator is appointed, whichever occurs first
- In July 2013 Triangle and the Acehese Government entered into a Joint Venture to secure and operate a new long term PSC to the Joint Venture
- The Acehese Government is in discussions with MIGAS and the Ministry for the award of the PSC
- Production during the September quarter totaled 82.8 MMcf
- Gross PSC revenue on production for the quarter: US\$1.050M

#### Morocco

- Triangle is awaiting the Office National des Hydrocarbures et des Mines (“ONHYM”) review of the applications and work programs that were submitted in January 2013 covering six Moroccan exploration blocks

#### Corporate

- 30 September 2013 cash balance of \$2.835M
- A placement of 187.5 million ordinary shares to sophisticated investors at \$0.008 per share to raise \$1,500,000 before costs was successfully completed



## PASE PSC (Aceh Province, North Sumatra, Indonesia)

### Pase Production

Production during the September quarter totaled 82.8 MMcf from three wells, A-1, A-5 and A-6. Production from A-1 has increased since the Company successfully carried-out a “Bull Head Acid Job” in September.

### Operational Activities

Total production during the quarter was reduced as a result of scale build-up in A-1 well. However, the production team performed a “Bull Head Acid Job” on A-1 in mid September to attempt to restore production to previous levels. The maintenance was successful and production is back at normal levels.

### Development Activities

During the quarter the Company continued technical studies over the Pase Field with the intent of maturing in-fill drilling opportunities to access up-dip gas adjacent to existing producing wells.

### Health, safety & environment

Triangle maintained its excellent operating record during the quarter with zero Lost Time Incidents, zero environment incidents and zero recordable motor incidents.

### Corporate Social Responsibility

Corporate social responsibility activities continued during the quarter these included maintenance on roads, bridges and local infrastructure and the restocking of medical supplies in local clinics.



### History of Pase PSC

#### *February 2012:*

- Pase PSC expires and MIGAS appoints Triangle as temporary Operator of the Block.

#### *February 2013:*

- Triangle is selected as the most qualified partner to operate the new long term PSC with the Aceh Government. Triangle was selected by a committee of government appointed Acehnese industry experts following an open tender process.

*July 2013:*

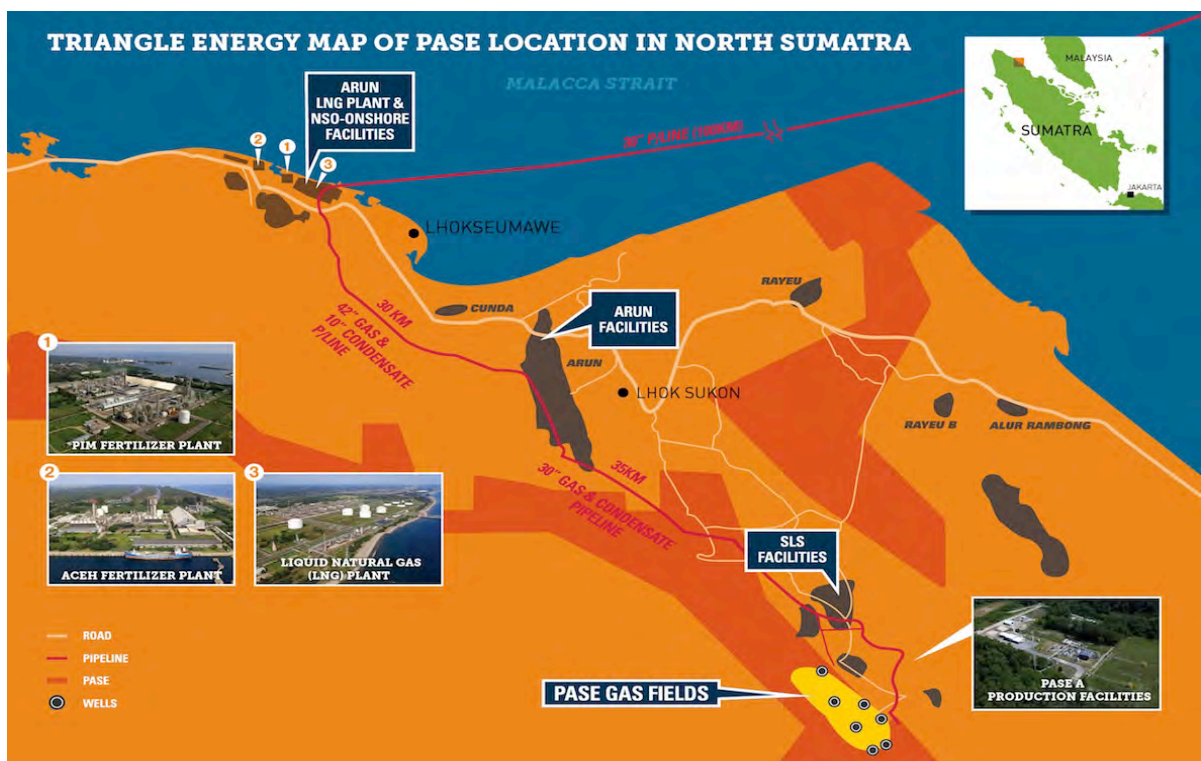
- Triangle and the Acehne Government entered into a Joint Venture to operate the new PSC. Triangle is the first oil and gas company to partner with Aceh under the 2005 Helsinki Memorandum of Understanding.
- Aceh Pase Global Energy Pte Ltd (“APGE”) is incorporated in Singapore as the joint venture company to operate the new PSC. APGE is 75% owned by Triangle and 25% by an Acehne Government owned company Perusahaan Daerah Pembangunan Aceh (“PDPA”).

*August 2013:*

- MIGAS extends Triangle’s appointment as the temporary Operator of the Pase Block for a further 6 months or until the appointment of a definitive operator.

*Current Status:*

- On behalf of APGE, the Acehne Government is in discussion with MIGAS to secure the award of a new PSC.
- Triangle is the first foreign company to form a JV with the Acehne Government to operate an oil and gas field and provides further exploration and production opportunities for Triangle in the Pase Block.







## MOROCCO

Triangle has submitted applications and work programs for six oil and gas concessions in Morocco and is now awaiting review by the Office National des Hydrocarbures et des Mines (“ONHYM”). Triangle will subsequently seek to negotiate and finalise with ONHYM the provisions of the petroleum agreements and associated contracts.

## CORPORATE ACTIVITIES

The Company reviewed a number of potential exploration and development opportunities in Indonesia.

## FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Gross PSC revenue on production for the quarter was US\$1.050M. Cash at bank at the end of the quarter was \$2.835M.

The Company completed a placement of 187.5 million shares to sophisticated investors pursuant to Section 708 of the Corporations Act (2001) at \$0.008 per share to raise \$1,500,000 before costs. 173,750,000 shares were issued in September with the remaining 13,750,000 shares to be issued to related parties upon shareholder approval at the Annual General Meeting to be held on 27 November 2013. The shares were issued under the Company’s 15% placement capacity pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

As at 30 September 2013 the Company had 1,108 shareholders and 1,618,725,458 ordinary fully paid shares on issue with the top 20 shareholders holding 59.9% of the total issued capital.

Triangle Energy is a gas production and exploration company based in Perth. The Company operates the Pase Production Sharing Contract located in Aceh Province, North Sumatra, Indonesia. Triangle Energy continues to assess acquisition prospects to diversify and grow the portfolio of assets.
