

Amcom signs University of Melbourne for Amcom Cloud Collaboration

Amcom Telecommunications Limited (ASX:AMM) today announces a significant contract with the University of Melbourne to deploy the Amcom Cloud Collaboration (ACC) telephony and unified communications solution across its entire university community of approximately 13,000 users. This is the first major ACC deployment in the higher education sector since Amcom signed a landmark partnering agreement with AARNet (Australia's Academic and Research Network), as announced on 1 May 2014. The University of Melbourne is one of Australia's premier universities and a member of AARNet.

The contract is significant for multiple reasons, including that it is:

- The largest publicly announced contract of its size for Cisco HCS and Amcom ACC in Australia
- Amcom's largest single Unified Communications contract to date
- The first University in Australia to move to Cisco HCS (Amcom ACC)

The ACC platform, powered by Cisco's Hosted Collaboration Solution (HCS), is a pay-as-you-use consumption based service which will integrate with the University of Melbourne's existing unified communications exchange, provided through AARNet. It will allow approximately 13,000 users, across 8 campuses in metropolitan and rural Victoria, access to an enterprise grade telephony and unified communications solution including; Telephony, Video Telephony, Voicemail, Instant Messaging, Presence and Mobility (collaboration on smartphones and tablets).

Importantly, the ACC solution will enable media rich calls to be securely routed between other universities and institutions on AARNet's unified communications exchange, anywhere in the world.

In line with Amcom's flexible 'evergreen' service offering, the University of Melbourne is able to embrace next generation collaboration solutions such as Telepresence, WebEx, and Contact Centre. Again these services are delivered on a pay-as-you-use consumption model, eliminating the need for large up front capital expenditure commitments.

Amcom CEO, Clive Stein said: "In a communications world rapidly moving towards consumption based payment models, the University of Melbourne's early move to adopt Amcom Cloud Collaboration is a clear indicator of the product's future potential in the higher education sector. Large scale contracts such as this validates the up-front investment Amcom has made in our ACC offering, leveraging off of our partnership with AARNet. Amcom continues to innovate alongside our key partners, such as Cisco, to deliver services that allow customers to rapidly scale up their technological solutions as required, without significant upfront capital investment."

Amcom's ACC services will be progressively rolled out across the University of Melbourne's 8 campuses over the remainder of calendar year 2014. Over time, Amcom's partnership with AARNet is expected to lead to other significant ACC contracts in the higher education sector.

Commenting on the wider opportunity for ACC in Australia, Clive Stein said "ACC is one of Amcom's new growth engines, enabling a greater share of customer wallet and geographic expansion into new regions. Amcom has already deployed 14 ACC solutions nationally to leading enterprises across various industry groups."
