Sydney Airport Traffic Performance September 2015

Sydney Airport Managing Director and CEO Kerrie Mather said, "Sydney Airport passenger traffic continued to perform strongly during September, with international and domestic passengers growing 5.2% and 3.3% respectively, compared to the prior corresponding period (pcp). The international result was primarily driven by a 3.8 percentage point improvement in load factors, while the domestic result was underpinned by a 2.2% increase in seat capacity.

"Foreign nationality demand (+7.1%) contributed to international passenger growth, with Chinese (+13.5%), USA (+8.9%) and Philippine (+48.5%) nationalities performing well. Australian outbound also grew strongly (+4.5%), as a result of increased demand over the school holiday period. The Philippines (+33.8%), Chile (+21.0%), UAE (+12.6%) and USA (+8.4%) were amongst the fastest growing destinations for Australian travellers.

"Domestic passengers grew 3.3% on the pcp as a result of a 2.2% increase in seat capacity and 0.8 percentage point increase in load factors. All four domestic airlines added seats compared to the pcp.

"This month we were delighted to announce Qatar Airways will commence services to Sydney from 1 March 2016. Qatar Airways will serve Sydney – Doha daily on a 335 seat B777-300ER, adding 245,000 seats annually. This new service announcement came as a result of the recent increase in the bilateral Air Service Agreement by seven additional weekly frequencies. Qatar Airways is one of the fastest growing airlines in the world and as Skytrax's 2015 Airline of the year, they will undoubtedly provide passengers with a quality product and connectivity to a wide range of destinations around the world."

Key Points

- Average international and domestic load factors improved by 3.8 and 0.8 percentage points respectively.
- Indonesia AirAsia X's inaugural launch occurred on 17 October, commencing services between Sydney and Denpasar five times weekly with a 377 seat A330-300. Indonesia AirAsia X CEO Dendy Kurniawan said "Our inaugural flight from Sydney to Bali recorded an impressive load factor of over 80%. We are confident that demand on this route will continue to be robust."
- Qantas announced it will commence seasonal services between Sydney and Bali as a result of increasing Australian demand. This will increase the Qantas group frequencies between Sydney and Bali by approximately 50% over December and January.
