Appendix 4C Quarterly Cash Flow Report 31 March 2016

14 April 2016 – Sydney, Australia & Auckland, New Zealand – Living Cell Technologies Limited today released its cash flow report for the quarter ended 31 March 2016. The Appendix 4C is attached. The company ended the quarter with a cash balance of \$5,208,798 compared to \$3,604,500 in the previous quarter. The increase is due to receipt of funds from the private placement partially offset by normal operating payments.

Net operating cash flow in the quarter was \$(838,116) compared to \$(892,296) in the previous quarter. Receipts from customers were \$33,101 (previous quarter \$20,884) reflecting services provided to the joint venture company. Operating payments were \$1,049,386 compared to \$1,053,109 in the previous quarter.

Investing activity payments include three instalments of the amount due to the joint venture for the purchase of pigs and plant and equipment.

Financing activity records receipt of funds from the private placement completed in February and the share purchase plan which was completed in April.

Chief executive Dr Ken Taylor said that the company is in a sound cash and operating position to proceed with the Phase IIb clinical trial of NTCELL[®] for Parkinson's disease which commenced on 24 March. The Phase IIb trial aims to confirm the most effective dose of NTCELL, define any placebo component of the response and further identify the initial target Parkinson's disease patient sub group. If the trial is successful the company will apply for provisional consent to treat paying patients in New Zealand.

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About Living Cell Technologies

Living Cell Technologies Limited (LCT) is an Australasian biotechnology company improving the wellbeing of people with serious diseases worldwide by discovering, developing and commercialising regenerative treatments which restore function using naturally occurring cells.

LCT's lead product, NTCELL[®], is an alginate coated capsule containing clusters of neonatal porcine choroid plexus cells. After transplantation NTCELL functions as a biological factory, producing factors to promote new central nervous system growth and repair disease-induced nerve degeneration.

The Phase I/IIa NTCELL clinical trial in New Zealand for the treatment of Parkinson's disease met the primary endpoint of safety and reversed progression of the disease after one year. Results from this trial were used to design a larger Phase IIb trial to confirm the most effective dose of NTCELL, define any placebo component of the response and further identify the initial target Parkinson's disease patient sub group. If the trial is successful the company will apply for provisional consent to treat paying patients in New Zealand and launch NTCELL as the first disease modifying treatment for Parkinson's disease in 2017.

In addition to Parkinson's disease, NTCELL has the potential to be used in a number of other central nervous system indications, including Huntington's, Alzheimer's and motor neurone diseases including amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS).

LCT's proprietary encapsulation technology, IMMUPEL[™], allows cell therapies to be used without the need for co-treatment with drugs that suppress the immune system.

LCT is listed on the Australian (ASX: LCT) and US (OTCQX: LVCLY) stock exchanges. The company is incorporated in Australia, with its operations based in New Zealand.
