

Revised MMP lodged for Mt. Porter

Sydney, 06 June 2016: The Board of Ark Mines Ltd (**ASX:AHK**) is pleased to advise that on 2 June 2016 it lodged with the Department of Mines and Energy in the Northern Territory its revised Mine Management Plan (MMP) for the Mt. Porter gold mining project.

The revised MMP strengthens the environmental and financial elements of the Mt. Porter project. A key aspect of the revision is a redesign of the closure strategy. AHK intend to backfill all waste material to the pit. This approach emphasises AHK's commitment to environmental stewardship, and provides long-term financial closure benefits.

Backfilling permits AHK to minimise long-term monitoring and maintenance commitments post closure.

AHK's Managing Director, Roger Jackson said: "Ark and its environmental consultants have worked closely with the DME in the NT on this exciting gold mining project, to come up with an environmentally responsible mining and rehabilitation process that actually makes better sense financially for Ark, over the short and longer term. This work has pushed back the commencement of the project but it has been a worthwhile exercise."
