Directors' report

The board of directors of Breville Group Limited has pleasure in submitting its report in respect of the financial half year ended 31 December 2016.

Review of results and operations

Revenues of the consolidated entity for the half year to 31 December 2016 were \$339,168,000, an increase of 2.4% from the revenues for the previous corresponding half year (2015: \$331,242,000).

The increase in revenue as compared to the previous corresponding half year was primarily a result of strong growth in the Global Product segment, with revenue for the half year increasing by 8.0% to \$264,826,000 (2015: \$245,126,000). The Distribution segment revenues of \$74,342,000 (2015: \$86,116,000) declined by 13.7% primarily due to products sold through the mass channel, with discount retailers continuing to favour their private label brands in the entry to mid-price points. In channels outside of the mass channel, however, the Distribution segment revenue was only slightly down over the prior comparative period (pcp).

Group EBIT increased by 6.7% to \$49,142,000 (2015: \$46,053,000) for the half year ended 31 December 2016. The Global Product segment EBIT for the half year increased by 12.0% to \$45,886,000 (2015: \$40,965,000) as the sale of higher margin products resulted in a more favourable product mix which, together with cost efficiencies, more than offset the adverse impact of the stronger transactional USD and the incremental increase in marketing and R&D expenditure. The Distribution segment EBIT of \$3,256,000 (2015: \$5,088,000) reflects the lower sales and reduction in EBIT margin to 4.4% from 5.9% in the pcp, driven mainly by the impact of a stronger transactional USD, offset marginally by lower marketing expenses and cost efficiency savings.

The basic earnings per share for the consolidated entity was 25.9 cents per share (2015: 23.7 cents per share).

Principal activities

During the half year, the principal activities of the consolidated entity were the innovation, development, marketing and distribution of small electrical appliances through two distinct business models as follows:

'Global Product' sells premium products designed and developed by Breville, which are sold globally (currently 65 countries). Products may be sold directly or through 3rd parties, and may be branded Breville, Sage or carry a 3rd party brand.

'Distribution" sells products that are designed and developed by a 3rd party. Breville distributes these products pursuant to a license or distribution agreement, or they are sourced directly from manufacturers. Products in this business unit may be sold under a brand owned by the group (e.g., Kambrook, Breville), or they may be distributed under a 3rd party brand (e.g. Nespresso or Philips).

Notes to the half year report

for the half year ended 31 December 2016

Note 1. Basis of preparation of the half year financial report

(a) Corporate information

The financial report of Breville Group Limited (the company) for the half year ended 31 December 2016 was authorised for issue in accordance with a resolution of the directors on 23 February 2017. Breville Group Limited is a for profit company limited by shares incorporated in Australia. Breville Group Limited shares are quoted on the Australian Securities Exchange.

The nature of the operations and principal activities of the group are described in the directors' report.

(b) Summary of significant accounting policies

The half year consolidated financial report does not include all notes of the type normally included within the annual financial report and therefore cannot be expected to provide as full an understanding of the financial performance, financial position and financing and investing activities of the consolidated entity as the full financial report.

The half year report should be read in conjunction with the annual report of Breville Group Limited for the year ending 30 June 2016.

It is also recommended that the half year report be considered together with any public announcements by Breville Group Limited and its controlled entities during the half year ended 31 December 2016 in accordance with the continuous disclosure obligations arising under the Corporations Act 2001.

Where necessary, comparatives have been reclassified and repositioned for consistency with current half year disclosures.

(i) Basis of accounting

The half year consolidated financial report is a general purpose financial report, which has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001 and AASB 134 *Interim Financial Reporting*.

The half year financial report has been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for derivative financial instruments that have been measured at fair value.

The amounts contained in this report have been rounded to the nearest \$1,000 (where rounding is applicable) under the option available to the company under ASIC Corporations (Rounding in Financial/Directors' Reports) Instrument 2016/191. The company is an entity to which the class order applies.

For the purpose of preparing the half year financial report, the half year has been treated as a discrete reporting period.

(ii) Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the half year consolidated financial statements are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the group's annual consolidated financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2016.

(iii) Basis of consolidation

The half year consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of Breville Group Limited and its subsidiaries as at 31 December 2016 (the group).

(c) Seasonality of operations

The financial performance of the group is exposed to seasonality in the volume of sales; such that the company's financial performance is historically weighted in favour of the half year to 31 December. This seasonality is a reflection of the additional retail sales generated during the Christmas trading period each year.

This seasonality in the volume of sales also generally results in a higher level of receivable and inventory balances at the half year compared to year end, usually resulting in a higher working capital requirement and lower operating cash flows at the half year.

Note 2. Operating segments

The following tables present the revenue and profit information regarding operating segments for the half year periods ended 31 December 2016 and 31 December 2015.

In the current period the company changed its external reporting segments to 'Global Product' and 'Distribution'.

This change reflects the transition from a dispersed, geographic structure to a centralised, business unit driven global structure. In this new organisational model, the two segments reflect the two business models in the company: (i) global, innovation driven, product business, and (ii) a distribution business. For both business units, the geographic regions execute the sales and distribution functions, supported by centralised functions (specifically, product development, marketing, and operations).

'Global Product' sells premium products designed and developed by Breville, which are sold globally (currently 65 countries). Products may be sold directly or through 3rd parties, and may be branded Breville, Sage or carry a 3rd party brand.

'Distribution' sells products that are designed and developed by a 3rd party. Breville distributes these products pursuant to a license or distribution agreement, or they are sourced directly from manufacturers. Products in this business unit may be sold under a brand owned by the group (e.g., Kambrook, Breville), or they may be distributed under a 3rd party brand (e.g. Nespresso or Philips).

Note 5. Financial assets and liabilities

Financial instruments

During the half year, the group designated forward exchange contracts in hedges of highly probable forecasted purchases of inventory, principally in USD. The forecast purchases are expected to occur between 0-12 months from 1 January 2017. The terms of the forward exchange contracts have been negotiated to match the terms of the forecast transactions. Consequently, the hedges were assessed to be highly effective. As at 31 December 2016, an unrealised gain of \$2,524,000 (2015: loss of \$138,000) is included in other comprehensive income.

Forward exchange contracts are initially recognised in the statement of financial position at fair value and subsequently remeasured to their fair value. Accordingly, there is no difference between the carrying value and the fair value of derivative financial instruments at reporting date. The carrying value and estimated net fair values of the borrowings held with banks is assumed to approximate their fair value, being the amount at which the liability could be settled in a current transaction between willing parties.

Fair value hierarchy

The group uses the following hierarchy for determining and disclosing the fair value of financial instruments by valuation technique:

Level 1 — quoted (unadjusted) prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2 — other techniques for which all inputs that have a significant effect on the recorded fair value are observable, either directly or indirectly

Level 3 — techniques that use inputs that have a significant effect on the recorded fair value that are not based on observable market data.

All forward exchange contracts were measured at fair value using the Level 2 method.

Valuation techniques

The forward exchange contracts are measured based on observable spot exchange rates, the yield curves of the respective currencies as well as the currency basis spreads between the respective currencies.

Note 6. Plant and equipment

Additions and disposals

During the half year ended 31 December 2016, the group capitalised items into plant and equipment with a cost of \$1,117,000 (2015: \$1,028,000). Plant and equipment with a net book value of \$25,000 was disposed of by the group during the half year ended 31 December 2016 (2015: nil), resulting in a profit on disposal of \$2,000 (2015: nil).
