Significant features of operating performance

The Company is currently invested in Australian fixed and floating income securities, with a total face value of \$6.9 million, all which are due to mature within 12 months of the balance date.

The profit of the Company for the half-year after providing for income tax amounted to \$155,132 (2015: \$600,947). The net asset value of the Company at 31 December 2016 was \$8,153,427 (30 June 2016: \$34,239,841). The net asset value per share at 31 December 2016 was \$19.18 (30 June 2016: \$80.55). The decline in the Company's profit was primarily driven by the reduction of the income producing assets of the Company as financial investments matured..

The weighted average number of shares for the half-year was 425,102. The basic and diluted earnings per share after tax was \$0.36 (31 December 2015: \$1.41).

Dividends and capital returns

During the half-year, the Company paid fully franked dividends of \$0.50 per share on 18 August 2016 and \$0.05 per share on 30 November 2016. The total amount of the dividends paid was \$212,551 and \$21,255 respectively.

As approved by shareholders at the General Meeting held on 25 November 2015, the Company made its Third and Fourth Capital Return of \$37.66 per share and \$23.52 on 18 August 2016 and 30 November 2016 respectively.

The directors present their report, together with the financial statements, on the Company for the half-year ended 31 December 2016.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the Company during the financial period was investing in Australian fixed and floating income securities.

Review of operations

The profit for the Company after providing for income tax amounted to \$155,132 (31 December 2015: \$600,947).

The net asset value of the Company at 31 December 2016 was \$8,153,427 (30 June 2016: \$34,239,841). The net asset value per share at 31 December 2016 was \$19.18 (30 June 2016: \$80.55). The decline in the Company's profit was primarily driven by the reduction of the income producing assets of the Company as financial investments matured or were sold during the period with the proceeds being paid out as capital returns to investors.

The weighted average number of shares for the half-year was 425,102. The basic and diluted earnings per share after tax was \$0.36 (31 December 2015: \$1.41).



1. General information

The financial statements cover Australian Masters Yield Fund No 2 Limited ("the Company") as an individual entity. The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

The Company is a listed public company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The financial statements were authorised for issue, in accordance with a resolution of directors, on 23 February 2017.

2. Significant accounting policies

These general purpose financial statements for the interim half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2016 have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 'Interim Financial Reporting' and the Corporations Act 2001, as appropriate for for-profit oriented entities. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 'Interim Financial Reporting'.

These general purpose financial statements do not include all the notes of the type normally included in annual financial statements. Accordingly, these financial statements are to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2016 and any public announcements made by the Company during the interim reporting period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements of the Corporations Act 2001.

The principal accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period, unless otherwise stated.

New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Company has adopted all of the new and revised Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are relevant to their operations and effective for the current half-year.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Company.

The following new and revised Standards and Interpretations have been adopted in the current period and, where applicable, only affect disclosure and presentation in this financial report.

- AASB 2015-1 '*Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards - Annual Improvements to Australian Accounting Standards 2012-2014 Cycle*'

- AASB 2015-2 '*Amendments to Australian Accounting Standards - Disclosure Initiative: Amendments to AASB 101*'

Walsh & Company Asset Management Pty Ltd

Mr Alexander MacLachlan is a Director of the Company and of the Manager, Walsh & Company Asset Management Pty Limited (“the Manager”).

The Manager is entitled to receive a management fee of 0.59% (excluding GST) per annum of the Value of the Portfolio. During the half-year ended 31 December 2016, Walsh & Company Asset Management Pty Limited was paid in advance an annual management fee of \$223,234 (2015: \$223,883), inclusive of GST. Of the total management fee, \$104,007 (2015: \$104,309) is included in prepayments at 31 December 2016.

Australian Fund Accounting Services Pty Limited

Australian Fund Accounting Services Pty Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Dixon Advisory Group Limited, the parent of the Manager, provides fund administration services under an agreement with the Manager. These services include net asset valuation, management accounting, statutory reporting, capital management and taxation.

Total fund administration fees paid or payable for the half-year ended 31 December 2016 were \$45,000 (31 December 2015: \$45,000), exclusive of GST.

No material amounts of contingent liabilities or capital commitments exist at balance date.
