ABOUT PAUL ONEILE

Mr Oneile was Non-Executive Chairman of Intecq Limited (formerly eBet Limited), a listed technology company which develops and markets networked solutions to the gaming industry from 2012 until its acquisition by Tabcorp Holdings Limited in December 2016.

From 2003 to 2008, Mr Oneile was CEO of Aristocrat Leisure Limited where he oversaw significant business and cultural change, refocused R&D spending, streamlined the supply chain operation, and successfully oversaw growth of the company's international operations.

From 1996 until 2003, Mr Oneile was Chairman and CEO of United International Pictures (UIP), the world's largest international film distributor, overseeing the corporation's worldwide operations from its London headquarters. Prior to that, he was a director of Village Roadshow Limited and Managing Director of The Greater Union Organisation for six years. Before that, he led UIP's Australian operations.

Other previous non-executive directorships include Film Finance Corporation Australia (now Screen Australia), and VUE Entertainment Holdings Limited.
