Molopo Energy Limited (“Molopo” or the “Company”) presents its quarterly report for the three months ended 31 March 2017.

Board

The following board changes during the quarter were as follows:

Yaniv Stern – resigned 27 February 2017.

Wayne Trumble – appointed independent non-executive director 27 February 2017.

Alexandre Gabovich – appointed 27 February 2017; and appointed Managing Director on 8 March 2017.

Samantha Tough – resigned 31 March 2017.

Capital:

The Company holds \$66.9M in cash reserves at the end of the quarter, earning interest revenues during the quarter of \$293K from treasury management of \$57.6M held on term deposit. The Company continued to minimize expenditure whilst conserving capital to maintain shareholder value.

Legal:

With respect to the legal actions in Canada concerning the Company and Molopo Energy Canada Ltd. (“MECL”), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company, during the quarter the Company was successful in having one action discontinued by the Plaintiff, 3105682 Nova Scotia ULC. The Board continued to manage the legal action however it will not be until August 2017 at the earliest before a trial date can be requested and a possibly a further year before a trial date is set for the matter to be resolved in Court. Attempts to agree an alternate resolution to this matter with the Plaintiff have, to date, not been successful.

Company Strategy:

Molopo continues to assess opportunities in the oil & gas sector. During the quarter, the Company continued extensive discussions with a number of selected investment candidates globally with a view to invest into assets in low political and economic risk environments.



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Corporate:

The Company received a S249D requisition notice from a shareholder, Keybridge Capital Limited, calling for a general meeting of shareholder to seek removal of the board and appoint three nominees to the Molopo Board. The board composition, as requested by Keybridge, will be considered at the upcoming annual general meeting to be held on Tuesday, 30 May 2017.

Following the end of the March quarter, Molopo submitted an application to the Takeovers Panel to consider whether Keybridge Capital Limited and Aurora Funds Management Limited are associates. The application is being considered by the Takeovers Panel.
